This year, we completed our 22-home project on Mesa Del Rio, with Nilsa Diaz and her family moving into our last home in the project. We are so proud of this community, and all the great families that we were able to help with a new direction in their lives.

The completion of the Mesa Del Rio project and the start of our next project in the San Jose area (corner of Clifton and Williams SE) would not have been possible without the generous support of our donors, sponsors, grantors, community partners, volunteers, and staff who have continued to support our work and mission. Thank you!

We have many great projects in the works for next year and into the future. Our next project is a 6-home development on Clifton SE. Following that we have a 10-home development on 62nd street NW, and finally a 6-home development on 64th St. NW

In addition to these 3 great community developments, we are excited to announce that we have expanded our service area to include the city of Rio Rancho and the town of Bernalillo. In the next few months, we will be introducing Habitat to the Sandoval County communities and telling the Habitat story.

Our Home Preservation & Repair program is in its 2nd year. We have exceeded all of our expectations in both the requested need, as well as the number of repair completions that were accomplished to keep individuals, especially the elderly and vulnerable, safely in their current homes.

Our ReStore had another outstanding year topping \$1.2 million in sales. We received national recognition from Habitat for Humanity International as being the No. 1 Restore across the United States. Miguel Sanchez, ReStore Director, and his staff want to thank everyone for their continued support in helping them become the No. 1 Restore. The ReStore has sponsored its second home for a family in need and has pledged to build a 3rd house this next year.

Finally, I am very proud of what Greater Albuquerque Habitat for Humanity has accomplished over the past 35 years because of the commitment and belief in our mission and vision from our donors, sponsors, grantors, volunteers, and our staff. I'm also very excited and believe that we will continue to grow and support family stability into the future through our vision of a world in which "Everyone has a decent place to live."






Johnele and her family moved into their new home in June of 2022.
